Prioritizing communication, quick phone access, and education uses.

- All pouches have three holes for access and control (Turn On & Voice Commands.)
- All classrooms have Tier 1 Magnet to “unlock” any Tier 1 Blue Pouches quickly and easily.
- Only a few students who ignore school policies will lock their devices in Tier 2 Orange Pouches.



3 Holes to Turn On and Make Voice Commands to Answer and Make Calls

Make a Call: “Hey [Bixby], Turn on Speaker and call [Contact]
Answer: “Hey [Bixby], Turn on Speaker and Answer Call.”

EASY-TO-USE

Silence phones and put them (with earbuds and smartwatches) with the screen facing the hole and the USB port facing the opening for access and control.



4 EFFECTIVE IMPLEMENTATION OPTIONS
(TOTAL BAN IS OPTIONAL)

To Enforce a Total Ban, Require Students to Turn Off Their Devices.

Collective Tier 2 Interventions and Administrator’s Tier 3 in All Implementation Options.

Number and give all classrooms at least one Tier 2 Orange Safe Pouch. It is a powerful visual cue, and it empowers teachers to enforce Tier 2 interventions not just for phone policies but also for many other class expectations and school policies.

Administrators and Campus Supervisors walk around and carry a few Tier 2 Orange Pouches to enforce when they see students have their devices out.

To enforce it: A staff locks students’ devices in Tier 2 pouches, collecting students’ IDs and documenting pouches numbers. Students get their IDs back when they return the pouch with the correct pouch number.

Tier 3 Interventions: Confiscation by Administrators, Parents Calls, Parent Conferences.

DAMAGED/VANDALIZED OR LOSS: Repair \$5 (Cost \$3) or Replacement \$15 (Cost \$13)

Priceless & Impactful Incentive System at School and Classroom Levels

School-level Pouch Points: Students arrive on time and follow all Safe Pouch’s expectations and procedures. Students use the points to exchange tickets for school events or privileges.

Classroom level Pouch Points: Students arrive on time and follow all Safe Pouch expectations and procedures. Students use the points to exchange Late Pass, Homework Pass, or Retakes.

Pro Tips: Actively cross out any unearned dates to prevent students from cheating.

Option 1: Students Take Care of Their Pouches and Bring them to School Daily

Step 1: Number and check out Tier 1 Blue Safe Pouch to students to take care and bring them daily.

Student Daily Task: At the entrances, students **Silence** their phones, and a dedicated staff member locks students’ phones, smartwatches, and earbuds in their pouches as they enter the school.

After school, teachers will unlock all Tier 1 pouches, but Tier 2 pouches will be unlocked at the Main Office after answering **Reflection Questions.**

Option 2: All Pouches Remains in Schools and Monitor by Teachers

Step 1: Number and distribute Tier 1 Blue Safe Pouch to all teachers, except those without 1st period, based on their 1st-period class sizes.

Student and Teacher Arrival Task: First-period students Silence their phones before entering their class. Then, they pick up a pouch and write its number next to their names on the roster. They put their phones, earbuds, and Smartwatch in the pouch and ask the teacher to lock it up.

Student and Teacher Dismissal Task: Sixth-period teachers unlock all Tier 1 Blue Safe Pouches to use them tomorrow. Students with Tier 2 Orange Safe Pouches unlock at the Main Office to return the pouches.

Sharing Pouches Tasks: Teachers without a first period give the basket of pouches to designated nearby teachers without a sixth period. Based on their first-period number, teachers return extra pouches or get more pouches from nearby storage places or from the library.

Option 3: Class Set of Tier 1 Blue Safe Pouch

1. Number pouches with the classroom and pouch number (Ex: J12 2 – J12 36).
2. Students silence their phones before entering class. Then, they pick up a pouch and write its number next to their names on the roster. They place their phones, earbuds, and smartwatches in the pouch and ask the teacher or a volunteer to lock them. Students also earn "Pouch Points." If a pouch is broken and there are no replacements, use a clip to lock it. Students avoid taking items out to prevent losing 5 Pouch Points. Meanwhile, request replacements and repairs.
3. At the end of class, the teacher, not a volunteer, unlocks all pouches, and any student who has a broken pouch will lose their 5 Pouch Points because they have attempted to break the pouches. (Use your best judgment and document students' behaviors).
4. Students use the points to purchase Late Pass, Homework Pass, or Re-take Assessments. Any unused points are counted as extra credits at the end.

Pro Tips: Let students know that you will call their parents if they refuse to lock up their phones for extra credit.

Option 4 (Very Limited Budget) : Partial Class Set of 6 – 10 Tier 1 Pouches.

1. Label and assign **6 –10 Tier 1 Blue Safe Pouches, 1 Magnet, and 1 Tier 2 Pouch** in all classrooms.
2. As students enter the school, they **Silence** their phones and put them with their smartwatches and earbuds in their backpacks.
3. **In-classroom enforcement:** Teachers immediately lock up students' phones, earbuds, and smartwatches if their students have them out in or near their classes.
4. **Administrators and Campus Supervisors:** Walking around with Tier 2 pouches to enforce policies by locking students' devices in Tier 2 pouches, collecting students' IDs, and documenting pouches numbers. Students get their IDs back when they return the pouch with the correct pouch number.

Having phone-free policies without effective tool to enforce is unrealistic.

Nearly all students possess a phone, earbuds, and a smartwatch. Students can discreetly use their phones without being noticed. More crucially, the small size of the earbuds, combined with their noise-canceling capabilities, makes them virtually undetectable by teachers. This ongoing struggle and the potential for direct confrontation often lead to teacher burnout.

Frequently Asked Questions/Concerns and Answers from Administrators

Students with documented medical or special education needs: Their pouches have unique labels to let all staff know to unlock the pouches of students whenever students need them. If they need it continuously, they can keep the phone in their pouch without locking it.

Students claim not having a phone: Students quickly show their pockets, ears, and inside their backpacks. They lock up their earbuds, smartwatches, or other distracting items if there are any. Those students still earn the Pouch Points. If students are caught having it out, they will lose 5 Points, and their devices will be locked up in Tier 2 Oranges. Repeated offenders will get their devices confiscated, and parents must pick them up.

Early Dismissal: Teachers unlock any Tier 1 Blue Safe Pouch. Students with Tier 2 Pouches need to get it unlocked at the Main Office.

Tardy to School: Students check in through the Main Office.

Washable? You can wash in COLD water with detergent and AIR DRY.

Checking Out Pouches: Through the library system or Google Spreadsheet and paper contracts.

Beyond Distraction-Free Benefits

It PROACTIVELY eliminates cyberbullying, school fights, and electronic distractions. Increasing students' personal interaction and participation in school activities would increase the school's climate while creating more opportunities for students to learn and practice SEL skills. **Data on students damaging their pouches helps identify Tier 3 early to provide more intensive interventions and support.**
